THE RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES OF SUNRISE ACADEMY STUDENTS

*Infractions will be continuously counted with every various level infraction. For example, if a student receives their first infraction with a level 1 offense, then receives another infraction with a level 2 offense, and then receives another level 1 infraction, then that student has 3 infractions total.

*Infractions are continuous throughout the year and do <u>not</u> start over every quarter. Behavior is held at high expectations at Sunrise Academy. We hold our students at high standards and expect exceptional Muslim behavior throughout the year.

*If students receive a lunch/recess detention from their teacher, then it is the responsibility of the teacher who issued this detention to stay with the student during that time. If the teacher has lunch/recess duty, then it is that teacher's responsibility to find an alternative teacher to stay with the student at that time.

*If the student received lunch/recess detention from administration, then the student will remain with the administrator or issued the detention.

<u>LEVEL 1 INFRACTIONS - CONDUCT THAT OBSTRUCTS ORDERLY OPERATIONS</u> <u>OF CLASSROOM OR SCHOOL</u>

Level 1 behavior should be handled by the classroom teacher whenever possible. Ordinarily, a teacher will not refer a student engaging in Level 1 behavior to the school principal until the classroom teacher has taken at least three documented, progressive level one disciplinary actions and has communicated with the student and parents/guardians. Thereafter the classroom teacher may refer the student to school administration through a written referral. However, earlier referrals may be made when the misbehavior occurs outside the classroom or in exceptional circumstances where the classroom teacher believes immediate outside assistance is necessary. **This list of violations is not all inclusive, but only representative and illustrative**. A student committing an improper act of misconduct, which does not happen to be specifically listed, is still subject to disciplinary action.

NOTE:

<u>Lunch/Recess Detentions</u>: Lunch/Recess Detentions will be held during the student's lunch and recess time. Students will be in a classroom supervised by a teacher, missing their recess and eating their lunch in the classroom with the teacher. Student will return to class after their lunch/recess time is over.

<u>Out of School Suspensions</u>: Student will spend the school day at home during a regular school day. Student must retrieve their missed assignments and complete them for full credit. Students have the number of days of suspension to make up their assigned work. For example, if the student is suspended for two (2) days, then he/she has two (2) days to make up his/her missed work. If the student does not return their assignments on time, they will then receive a zero (0) for that assignment.

<u>Open Suspensions</u>: Number of days suspended will be determined by the school board and the student will be at home on suspension pending decision by School Affairs Committee of the School Board. Students will be required to make up any assignments and turn them for full credit. (Same guidelines for making up missed assignments as Out of School Suspension).

LEVEL 2 INFRACTIONS - ILLEGAL AND/OR SERIOUS CONDUCT

A student charged with a Level 2 violation shall be subject to the disciplinary actions listed below. Contact will be made either through a personal conference, phone conference, or in the event the previous are not possible, through written communication by school administration. This list of violations is not all inclusive, but only representative and illustrative. A student committing an improper act of misconduct that is not directly stated will still be subject to disciplinary action at the discretion of the Principal's. Each violation will require the student to write a grade level appropriate explanatory paper describing the offense and complete relevant coursework to make restitution for the offense. Completion of the explanatory paper and coursework must be approved by the school administration before the student can return to the classroom. Parents will be contacted by the school in case of any Level 2 infraction.

<u>LEVEL 3 INFRACTIONS - CONDUCT THAT IS SERIOUS OR ILLEGAL AND IS</u> <u>POTENTIALLY LIFE OR HEALTH THREATENING.</u>

Sunrise Academy considers all three level infractions to be very detrimental to the school and its students. A student charged with a Level 3 violation may be subject to an immediate open suspension of up to 14 days and a recommendation for expulsion to the school board and/or legal action. Students expelled from Sunrise Academy due to level three infractions may not be reinstated at a later date. The proper authorities will be notified in the event that a student commits any illegal act. Parent(s)/guardian(s) will be required to meet with school personnel and the proper authorities. This list of violations is not all inclusive, but only representative and illustrative. A student committing an improper act of misconduct, which does not happen to be specifically listed, is still subject to disciplinary and/or legal action.

All suspensions will be recorded in student's file. Any Level I, II or III infraction will be subject to student's age level and severity of offense. <u>All consequences may vary depending</u> on the severity of the situation.

LUNCH DETENTION

Lunch detentions are given for level 1 infraction, and some minor level 2 infractions. A referral for a detention is written by the staff member who issued the infraction.

USE OF PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES AT SCHOOL

No radios, tape or digital recorders, phones, beepers, games, MP3 players, IPODS, or other electronic devices are permissible unless used as a part of a class or project or in an Emergency situation and are approved by a teacher or school administration. The device will be confiscated and given to the parent/guardian when they collect it from the administrator's office. If a parent/guardian wishes to contact his/her child during school hours it must be done through the school's main office.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Parents/guardians may in writing, submit any grievances concerning the disciplinary action taken by the school administration or any other matter to the school affairs committee of the school board. The committee will review the grievance and will respond in writing. Parents/guardians may request a meeting to present their grievance to the committee directly. However, the committee may choose the manner of their response.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

If a student earns three suspensions, he/she will be placed on disciplinary probation. He/she also may be placed on probation by the administration or the school affairs committee for committing a level three infraction. If a student commits a suspendable offense while on probation, he/she will be placed on an open suspension and their name will be submitted to the school affairs committee for possible expulsion. After a student receives 3 suspensions, they will be required to meet with their parents and the school board School Affairs Committee to discuss possible expulsion from Sunrise Academy.

Students are expected to serve all disciplinary assignments given to them, or further action will be taken. Students on suspensions may not participate in extracurricular activities. The administration will review the discipline record of each student throughout the school year. Students with poor discipline records for that school year will be referred to the School Affairs Committee even if they have not been placed on probation.

Sunrise Academy reserves the right to refuse readmission for the next year to students with poor discipline records. Sunrise Academy also reserves the right to refuse admission/readmission to students whose parents have exhibited inappropriate Islamic (includes verbal and physical abuse, sexual abuse, using profanity, etc.) toward any staff member or student at Sunrise Academy.

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EXPULSION PROCEDURES

A student may be referred to the school affairs committee for expulsion as a result of receiving a suspension while they are on disciplinary probation, subsequent committing of level two infraction, or as a result of committing a level three infraction.

- 1. When a student is referred to the School Affairs Committee for expulsion, the family will be informed in writing that the student is placed on open suspension and will describe the reason for the school's action.
- 2. The school affairs committee will hold a meeting to review the case within 14 school days from the day of suspension.

- 3. The student and his/her guardian may appeal in writing to present their case to the school affairs committee.
- 4. The school affairs committee will make a decision that will be conveyed to the parents/guardians in writing as soon as possible.
- 5. The decision of the school affairs committee is final.

Students on open suspensions may not return to school without a decision from the School Affairs Committee. They may not be on school premises or participate in any school activity or function including field trips or after school events. Sunrise Academy reserves the right to contact the Hilliard Police Department should a situation escalate so that a staff member, parent or student feels threatened in any way.

STUDENT WELFARE-CHILD ABUSE POLICY

According to Ohio law, a staff member who has reasonable cause to suspect that a student may be an abused or neglected child shall report such a case to the Department of Children and Family Services. In such a situation, the staff member shall notify school administration that a report has been made. Traditional consideration of confidentiality shall not constitute grounds for failure to report such cases.

Abuse and neglect as defined by Ohio law but may generally be understood as follows:

- 1. "Abuse" is any physical or mental injury or sexual abuse inflicted on a child other than by accidental means by a person who is responsible for the child's health and welfare.
- 2. "Neglect" is abandoning a child, subjecting a child to an environment injurious to his/her welfare, or failing to provide the proper support, education, or mental or remedial care required by law by one who is responsible for the child's welfare.

DISCIPINARY ACTION PLAN COMMITTEE

The disciplinary action committee consists of the school Principal, Academic Coordinator and the Teacher on duty the day of the occurrence and the School Administration (individuals may be excluded if there is a conflict of interest). They together will decide on what will institute a Level 2 or Level 3 infraction and will be the deciding committee in collaboration with the school board chair on what disciplinary action will be given.
